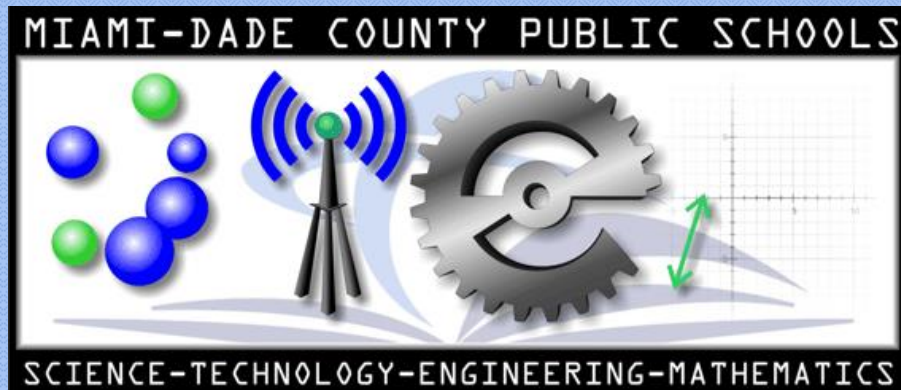

Economic & Societal Burden of Workplace Injuries and Illnesses



\$263 Billion (total)

\$6 Billion (fatal injuries)

\$196 Billion (nonfatal injuries)

\$48 Billion (fatal illness)

\$13 Billion (nonfatal illness)

This amount exceeds the individual cost of cancer, coronary heart disease, stroke, and diabetes.

National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH/CDC)

- Youth are twice as likely as adults to get hurt at work. By the time they finish high school, 80% of U.S. teens have held a job. The vast majority of them enter the work force unprepared for the challenges-and hazards-they face.
- That is why M-DCPS is collaborating with the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), part of the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), to give students vital skills they will need to stay safe and healthy on the job now—and throughout their lives.

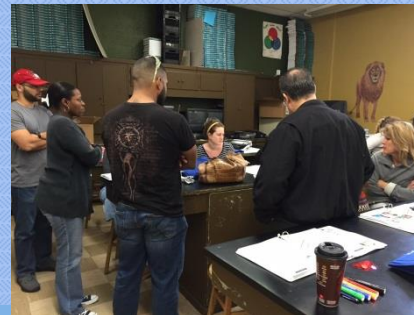
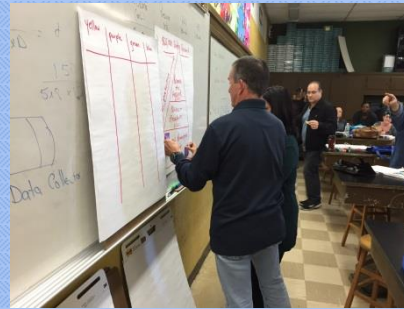
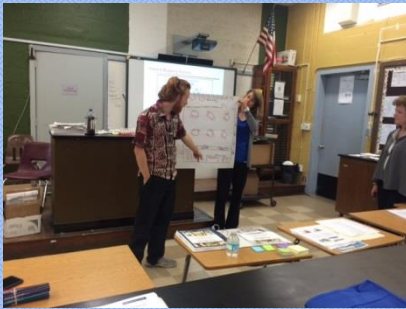
- Curriculum first introduced in May 2014.

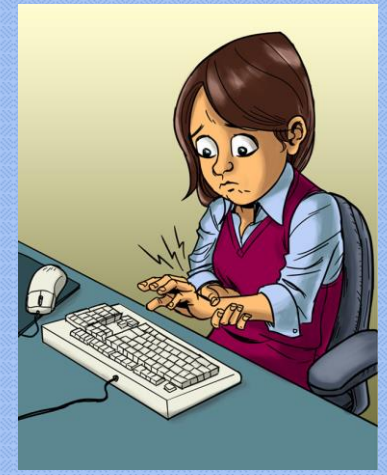


- NIOSH trained over 50 M-DCPS middle school science departments heads and eighth grade science teachers in the Work Safety curriculum.
